Summer Craft Ideas



Driftwood Art

You can make a lot of different pieces of artwork with driftwood and this is one of the examples. It has a driftwood background which can have any image on it.

- Collect some driftwood from the beach.
- Use hot glue to stick the driftwood into a frame or box of your choice.
- Stick the animal, plant or shell onto the driftwood with hot glue.



Button shapes

You can choose to use a template from online or you could create your own as a base for your button shape.

- Choose some buttons that are right for your shape. Such as orange buttons or purple buttons.
- Stick them onto your card or paper using hot glue or PVA.
- Layer your buttons to make a more interesting shape.
- Add lots of detail.
- Put your button shape in a frame or send it to someone as a card.
