Helen and Mark will be planting the bed alongside Rosemary, at no. 17, putting in shrubs, pinks and catmint and narcissi which should provide all year-round fragrance. We expect to have it finished by Christmas.

Changes and Repairs to Houses

The ethos of Maisemore Gardens has always been to keep the general appearance of the road as it was originally conceived. This has been backed by the wish of members through the years. This means that any changes, or repairs, to houses must be <u>agreed in writing</u> by the Council of Management (CoM) prior to work being carried out.

There is a more relaxed attitude to changes at the back of properties, but these also must be agreed by neighbours and by the <u>CoM in writing</u>. Internal changes which are structural must have permission.

The CoM will reply to a request within a week stating when their considered decision can be expected; this may be very soon for a simple request.

There have been a number cases recently of members carrying out changes to the front of their properties without written consent. This causes embarrassment and problems for the owner in the future when trying to sell a house with outstanding un-approved work.

We are in the process of writing a comprehensive guide to working on properties, but in the meantime PLEASE REMEMBER, play safe, don't do anything without written agreement.

Dinghy Park

The dinghy park is looking very tidy and organised now after the recent working party. We thank Barry King-Smith and those who helped on a fine dry morning. We intend to improve the retaining wall by the boat rack near the entrance in the near future. We will then in-fill and level and replace the rack. This should give a bit more space as well as a secure platform.

Notice Board

You will have noticed (no pun intended) that the notice board is now erected, after initially cutting through the BT telephone cable while digging holes for the legs. This effected a number of resident's telephone lines for a while. Thank go to James Leeming who spent ages on his mobile phone talking to BT to get the lines fixed and Barry who helped Openreach dig up the broken cable so that the section could be replaced as quickly as possible.
